

In Memory of an English Aviculturist-**Peter Tabony**

Peter Tabony passed from this world February 18, 1986 after a lengthy and valiant struggle against cancer. He owned and operated Blean Bird Garden near Canterbury Kent, England. The facilities house one of the largest private collections in England. There are macaws, cockatoos, parakeets, owls, softbills, peafowl and pheasants, with some macaws flying at liberty — something which he was very proud of. The family will continue with the management of his legacy.

Mr. Tabony attended the AFA convention in Florida in 1984 and also the 1985 convention in San Francisco. He was sought by many to speak about his "cockies" and macaws. He also flew to Utah following the San Francisco convention where he was a guest speaker at a local bird club. All who came to know him fell in love with his charm and wit. Those of us here and around the world. who knew him mourn the loss of a very dear and much-loved man. He will be remembered for his extraordinary contributions to aviculture.
