

Breeding Psittacines in Captivity Seminar Sunday, January 29, 1989

Sponsored by the Avian Research Fund



Emeryville, California

(San Francisco area)

This seminar has been planned to cover as much information as possible in one day on the breeding of psittacine birds. Aviculturists specializing in the breeding of certain species have been selected to make slide and lecture presentations on those birds. These presentations will cover the details of breeding set-ups, breeding behaviors, nest boxes, aviaries or cages, diets, and expectations regarding productivity of the specific species. Veterinarians will cover psittacine anatomy and physiology, diseases of the reproductive system, psittacosis, psittacine beak and feather syndrome, and management of infectious diseases. Also, a new systematic approach to breeding productivity will be introduced. The goals of these lectures are to increase the successful production of healthy offspring.

All profits from the seminar are donated to avian research: American Federation of Aviculture; Association of Avian Veterinarians, and Dept. of Avian Sciences

at UC Davis, California.

The seminar will be held at the Holiday Inn, Bay Bridge at 1800 Powell Street, Emeryville, California. This hotel is easily accessible from the Oakland Airport or the San Francisco Airport and is located immediately off 880 near the intersection of major freeways and the Bay Bridge leading to San Francisco from Oakland or Berkeley.

Seminar recipients will receive a soft-bound copy of the presentations of the speakers as they register on Sunday morning. 
